Nurturing Skills Learner Fund 2025 2026



The Nurturing Skills Learner Fund (NSLF) is now open to applicants for the academic year 2025/2026. NSLF will cover 90% of the course fees for successful applicants.

Applicants should contact <u>NSLF@pobal.ie</u> to request a link to register on the NSLF Student Portal, upload their employment details and complete the new application process. The application process **closes** on **1st May 2025**.

Easter closures and compliance

As some services may close for the Easter break, dates during 14-18 and/or 21-25 April, it may be necessary to make the following changes on your Early Years Hive.

Please note: Good Friday, 18 April 2025, is not a public holiday.

We advise making any necessary changes as soon as possible to ensure there are no issues when returns are submitted and payments processed.

NCS: Service calendar and returns

If your service is closed, you must mark the closures on your NCS service calendar accordingly. You must also note whether it is a subsidised (paid) closure or not.

Changes cannot be made to service calendar opening hours or claim hours once a return for that week has been submitted on the Early Years Hive.

NCS: Updated bridging payments

A 'bridging payment' is available to service providers during periods of subsidised closure, if they are unavailable to submit their weekly NCS return, for example, mid-term breaks, Easter, Christmas etc.

ECCE: Service calendar

ECCE programme rules state that changes to the ECCE calendars must be first approved by the Childcare Care Committee and parents must be given 20 working days' notice of any changes to the calendar.

Employers also have a legal duty to ensure the safety, health, and welfare of their employees under the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005.

- Understanding regulatory and legal responsibilities
- Planning ahead for emergencies and critical incidents
- Learning how to respond professionally and appropriately in a crisis



Supporting Behaviours in Neurodivergent Children

Ciara Watson from Autism Supports led out training for ELC & SAC last Saturday 5th April. Ciara has a wealth of expertise & knowledge and also her own unique experience of neurodivergence. Those that attended this training all commented how interactive and relatable it was, with plenty of time to ask questions. They learned really valuable strategies that they can take away and apply to children they have in their own settings.

Some of the comments from participants on what they found most useful included:

"strategies for avoiding meltdowns", " learning how their mind works, how they see things on a daily basis", "I loved the visuals and daily routines" " the visual aids & social stories were brilliant".

All participants recommended this type of training for all those working with children and also said that it would be brilliant for parents.


